Summary of the Presentation

Summary: ABE instructors must learn new apps and technologies to maximize students' remote learning outcomes. By using Zoom annotation tools and Google extensions such as Kami and Google Docs in class, students can practice more reading and typing online in an environment similar to the actual ABE test and study setting. In this workshop session, attendees will learn about and exchange online remote instruction techniques that support this goal.

- ► <u>MD Digital Framework</u> offers examples and guidelines for the 'Digital Literacy' with the 'Instructor Digital Guide'.
- WIOA (Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act) encourages 'Digital Literacy' among the programs for the workplace preparation.
- ▶ <u>GED.com</u>, which is the website for my students' test-taking application and information, has introduced the computer format to replace the paper and pencil in 2014, and since that time, they have promoted the 'Digital Literacy' skills for students' career readiness and as GED test taking essentials.

Background of GED Prep Students

GED?

- General Educational Development Test
- Graduate Equivalency Degree
- General Educational Diploma

GED Test format: Reading-Writing-Editing

- Reading: students must be comfortable with reading from the screen
- Writing: students should practice typing online before the test
- Editing: students need to learn more structural knowledge

Online proctored test available:

- GED Ready test first
- CASAS Test each session
- Check the webcam and other technology settings before the test


Advanced 'Zoom' Tools

'Zoom' Tools: Mute/Unmute, Start Video/Stop Video, Background, Security (Lock Meeting, Enable Waiting Room, Share Screen, Chat,, Rename themselves, Start Video), Participants (Name change, Classmates, Thumb up or down), Poll, Chat, Share Screen (Advanced: only a portion of screen), Pause Share/Resume Share (to control what you want to show), Annotate (More: Disable annotation for others), Record to the cloud, Hide/Show annotator names (When you share the screen, you will have more options), Breakout rooms, Zoom report, ... anything else?


"Zoom Essentials in Class

- Zoom name change: to show official names for the report
- 'Rise a hand' function: to ask a question
- Mute/Unmute: from teachers' side, control the students' background noise
- Start/Stop video: when students take the test; when recording
- Chat: to exchange messages and links
- Breakout rooms: for group activities and CASAS Test
- Fine exchange: may not work; then, email the students
- Virtual background: less distraction and more attention
- "Play with the Zoom!"




Download 'Kami' from Google Extension

- Why? Better than Zoom annotation tools; it stays like the real writing in a document in 'Kami'`

From Students' Side...


- ▶ They can use it as a picture or PDF reader and annotator

- Usually for 'Icebreaking' Purpose
- ► To practice several sentences in class
- To share ideas with others
- Here is an example:

Peardeck.com

- Ask students to type and share their ideas and sentences; editing and writing to discuss in class
- After watching videos, I ask students to freely type from what they understood
- Here is an example video from a class.
- Peardeck Video (52:30) (59:53) (1:00:53)



Google Docs



- Make students fill out 'Graphic Organizers'
- Receive and return students' essays with comments
- GED.com doesn't offer paper and pencil any more, but they still offer the electronic whiteboard, which is similar to Google Doc
- Here are examples of Google Docs use from students;
- Graphic Organizer in Google Docs
- Weekly Writing Assignment with Comments (Example)
- <u>Teachers' Practice</u> (PD Conference Activity)

Further Concerns

- GED test prep students prepare for the online test.
- Students need to know how to manage online tools from the first day: some students struggle even with the Zoom.
- After practicing the annotation tool Zoom and Kami, they need to practice Google Docs for the GED essay writing.
- During the session, GED class students take the eCASAS test.
- Around the end of each session, students are encouraged to take the GED Ready test.
- After the Green score (the passing score 145), students should apply and take the actual test as soon as possible; it expires in 60 days.

More Stories: GED Level Class Students

- Google Classroom Connection: Google Docs and Kami
- Peardeck, Padlet use in class to interact with their writing/typing instantly
- ▶ GED Ready test at the end of the session: Green score, from 145
- Students feel more comfortable with online tools and test questions.
- ▶ The more they are exposed to, the better they score and feel comfortable with online tests.
