










WhatsApp Tips

- Most students are familiar with WhatsApp
- You need at least one student contact to start a group



- Add your students as contacts after they join the group
- Choose a class icon and label each group clearly
- https://faq.whatsapp.com/iphone/chats/how-to-create-and-invite-into-a-group/?lang=en

- Post homework, community resources, comments related to class...
- Places to visit in the area (cherry blossoms...)
- On the weekends: "Post a picture of..."



Don't delete the group after the class ends--students will continue to communicate with each other here!

Conversation Groups

Welcome to conversation groups!

You will meet:

- -once a week in class for about 20 minutes during our warmup time
- -once a week <u>outside of class</u> at a time that works for everyone in your group for 30 minutes or more.

Leader responsibilities:

One of you should be the leader for each meeting. Everyone should have a chance to be the leader. The leader will....

- -create the meeting (Zoom, Skype, WhatsApp Video call, etc)
- -be responsible for keeping the conversation going by
 - -preparing topics ahead of time
 - -encouraging each person to talk
 - -asking questions
 - -wrapping up the conversation at the end

Requirements are:

- -to communicate with each other about timing if you need to change the time or you cannot come.
- -to always be respectful (obviously) :)

First meeting (today, now):

- -introduce yourselves
- -create a WhatsApp group
- -choose your meeting time outside of class
- -decide how you will meet outside of class
- ***Conversation topics might be related to your country, your culture, jobs, covid, living away from your country, advice on how to do something, places you have visited in the area, and where you would like to visit after covid... You can find a lot of conversation topic ideas on Google. There are a lot of ideas here:

- ***The objectives of our conversation groups are:
- -to increase fluency by engaging in conversation in a friendly, safe environment
- -to improve all aspects of English through language negotiation when there is language breakdown including pronunciation, grammar, vocabulary and comprehension skills
- -to increase camaraderie in the class, and decrease the "affective filter"
- -to build lasting, supportive friendships in the class and beyond



Conversation Starters For A Casual Get-Together A casual get-together with friends is a good place to ask quirky questions. Find out fun information about your friends and acquaintances that you may have never known otherwise!

- If you were on death row, what would your last meal be?
